I'm wearing this tag to help prevent children from drowning. I agree to supervise children in and around water. I will not leave the area without a replacement. **A Water Watcher is not a certified lifeguard and is not trained to perform emergency rescues.**

LAYERS OF PROTECTION

1 SUPERVISION 2 BARRIERS 3 EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

- Assign an adult to constantly watch the children and wear this tag at all times that children are in or near water.
- If the assigned adult needs to leave, assign the responsibility of watching the children and wearing this tag to another adult.
- Never leave children alone in or near water, even for a moment.
- Use barriers to block children from the water area like four-sided fencing that's at least five feet high, self-closing and self-latching gates, door and window alarms.
- Be prepared by learning CPR, keeping rescue equipment and a phone in the pool or water area.
